## A Coastal Clean-Up Event featuring artist sTo Len

Join artist sTo Len, University of New Haven's COASTS project (Citizen Opportunities for Accessing Science Training on the Sound), New Haven Climate Movement, and Save the Sound for a coastal cleanup event at Canal Dock and Long Wharf.
